I know this because empty my car was 12 lbs under weight last season so it was really important that i had gas in the car. At miller last year my car came in at 2603... way too close, I chugged alot of water at grid and pushed my car rather than let it idle.

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I always throw in 5 before a race. 5 gal usally gets me through a 30 to 40 minute race and I run the car about 1/4 tank or less.

I am pretty sure that on my street 944 Turbo they reserve light comes on at 3 gallons left in the tank. It uses the 21.1 gal plastic tank. I never checked that closely with my steel tank NA race car.
